We are looking forward to having your pup here with us for training! Included here is a 2017 Reservation and Training Agreement form for you to fill out. Once we've received the completed form and deposit we will be able to hold your dog a spot in our training class.

Our training format is structured in a way that works with the canine learning process. We work very hard to constantly read a dog's mental state throughout the training format by watching his or her body language to determine how they are responding to their environment and to our training. We believe a dog is like a book, all you have to do is read it to get your instructions.

Prior to Basic Formal Training we recommend that your dog gain experience and prey drive through bird exposure. For that purpose, we offer Puppy Development Classes. This is a great opportunity for young dogs that have not had much experience in the field. We will immerse your dog in multiple bird contacts every day, introduce him to the field, and properly introduce him to sound of the gun. During this class we do not teach any rules, just give the dogs the opportunity to develop their inherent prey drive and passion for bird hunting. If your dog has not had much opportunity to locate and work birds, this class will be very valuable in bringing out his natural talents.

Our first month of Basic Formal Training concentrates on continuing to build each dog's natural prey drive and developing a point of contact for "whoa." We divide the class's workouts into a morning and an afternoon session. The morning sessions consist of workouts on multiple birds. We will checkcord your dog out into the field, when he or she goes on point we carefully kneel down beside the dog and hold him through the flush. This allows us to show the dog the desired behavior (for example, not going in and grabbing the bird or chasing it off) and allows us to pre-condition a point of contact on the flank. The checkcord work also develops a point of contact on the neck for heeling, coming to you and quartering in the field. We will work on the natural retrieve every day during this stage. The afternoon workouts are on the whoa post, which is the hub of our training format. During the whoa post sessions dogs learn that a cue on the flank means to stand still. This cue will transition to the e-collar later on so that we can stop the dog in the field.

The second month of Basic Formal Training consists of transitioning from the mechanical cues of the checkcord and whoa post to the remote cue of the e-collar. Once we complete the whoa post work we have the ability to place an e-collar around a dog's flank and stop him using continuous stimulation at a low level. This ability to stop the dog with the e-collar allows us to stop a dog for bird work or handling at any time, with no negative connotation in the dog's state of mind. The cue on the flank simply means stop. We can now turn the dog loose in the field and begin to handle the dog and begin shaping their behavior on birds. We will work with an artificial backing dog to teach our dogs to honor another's point. Now also, with a simple push of the button, we can gently "stop the chase." Stopping the chase is the first step in getting a dog to point. Once that is learned behavior we begin to stop the dog from creeping in prior to the flush. When that is accomplished the dog will understand the desired behavior is to point and stand still until released by the report of a gun or a cue from a handler. Our flushing dogs will begin to "hup" at this point, that is to flush the bird and then sit as the bird flushes.

The third month begins the more advanced work of handling through cues on the neck. Repetitions are crucial at this point to work toward the point of learned behavior. When dog's go home at the end of the basic format they will be just at the cusp of learned behavior. This is where the owner comes in. We love to have owners work with us as much as possible, as it gives them a sense of familiarity with the training process. Our training has given the dog and the owner the tools to be a successful team in the field, however, in order for the dog to become the best that he or she can become it is up to the owner to maintain a level of performance during the actual hunts. The first season in a hunting dog's career is crucial in developing manners and setting behaviors. Our set of tools will give you the ability to have a mannerly dog that is a pleasure to be with in the field and at home.

After the Basic Formal Training Class is completed, your dog will be eligible for our Tune Up Classes and Wild Bird Excursions. This may be done at various times throughout the year. Check with us to see what opportunities may fit your needs.

We also offer an Obedience Class where we can work with your sporting dog to develop their general manners. All of the obedience elements that we teach during the Basic Formal Training Class will be taught here, the bird and field work will be excluded. It is our goal to teach each dog to be a gentleman or lady, to heel quietly by your side on a loose lease and off lead with an ecollar, to come to you when asked, sit or stay on command, wait at doors and gates, not jump on people, and generally be a pleasure to be around. We can customize your dog's experience during the Obedience Class if there are specific areas they need help in.

We are proud of our training format and the success we continually see with it. It is rare that a dog we accept for training doesn't "make." We take a great deal of pride in working with the dogs to become confident and enthusiastic hunting dogs. We strive to produce eager bird hunters that are a pleasure to be around, both in the field and in the home. The mental and physical well being of our training dogs is very important to us and we do our best to meet each dog's particular needs.

We will need to schedule your dog to arrive no later than the first week of the training class. Please let us know in advance when your dog will be arriving and whether your dog will be delivered to the Kennels at Big Cabin or flown into the Tulsa International Airport.

We welcome you to visit your dog during it's training with us. If you would like to schedule a visit, just let us know. We strongly prefer all visits to be after the dog's completion of the first month of training. This allows the dog ample time to settle into their new environment and routine before the disruption of a visit.

TRAINING AGREEMENT & RELEASE OF LIABILITY

In delivering my dog(s) to Ronnie Smith Kennels LLC (the "Kennels"), I agree that the Kennels is to undertake training, board, and care for that animal(s). A deposit of \$350 per dog is required in order to reserve a place in the training class. This deposit will be applied to the cost of the first month of training. Training costs for dogs owned by the Flying J Ranch for classes held at the Kennels' facility in Big Cabin, Oklahoma are :

- \$595 per month for Puppy Development,
- \$895 per month for Basic Formal Training (a three month program)
- \$995 per month for Wild Bird Excursion and
- \$1,590 flat rate for Trained to Retrieve Program (minimum of 2 months).

A charge of \$20 a day will be incurred for dogs boarded with Ronnie Smith Kennels LLC while not in training. Monthly payments for training and other incidental services are due at the beginning of each month. High quality feed (Purina ProPlan Sport), birds, and training supplies will be provided by the Kennels. Any other expense incurred, such as veterinarian bills, will be paid by the owner of the dog(s).

The owner warrants the dog is in good health, is free of communicable diseases, and has neither internal nor external parasites. Owner is responsible for paying any health related expense while their dog is at the facility.

Dogs in training at Ronnie Smith Kennels LLC are required to participate in the Kennel's healthcare program, including worming and immunization. Proof of current vaccinations (We recommend: Bordetella, parvovirus, distemper, adenovirus hepatitis, leptospirosis.) must be provided at the time the dogs are delivered to the Kennels. The Kennels administer heartworm preventative, flea and tick preventative, and wormers on the first of each month. All medications should be brought with dog when delivered to Ronnie Smith Kennels.

In order to allow dogs to perform to their fullest ability, Ronnie Smith Kennels LLC recommends long haired dogs be sheared during the summer months. This may be done by the owner or the owner's groomer prior to the dog's delivery. If a dog is in need of shearing, the Kennels will provide that service at a charge of \$35. Ronnie Smith Kennels LLC reserves the right to shear any dog to help it in the heat.

In case of an emergency the Kennels is authorized to obtain a veterinarian's services, should the Kennels deem necessary. The Kennels may assume the owner desires surgical care if recommended by the veterinarian in an emergency or in the case of a life threatening illness, unless previously specified otherwise by the owner.

Owner understands that dogs sometimes exhibit behavior that cannot reasonably be anticipated by any individual, even one who is very familiar with dogs and dog behavior. Owner understands there are inherent risks associated with training bird dogs and agrees to hold harmless, release, and discharge Ronnie Smith

Kennels, its owners, agents, employees, officer's, representatives, assigns, and others acting on the Kennel's behalf from all claims, demands, causes of action, and legal liability for any economic or non-economic loss due to bodily injury, death, property damage, or any other incident resulting from the care, travel, and training of the animal, except in the event of willful and wanton negligence on the part of the Kennels.

Owner holds Ronnie Smith Kennels, its owners, agents, employees, officer's, representatives, assigns, and others acting on the Kennel's behalf from all claims harmless in the event owner's dog is at cause in generating harm or injury to 1) any other dog custody of Ronnie Smith Kennels and/or 2) any individual who comes in contact with owner's dog while the dog in custody of Ronnie Smith Kennels.

Owner also agrees to hold harmless, releases, and discharges any landowners who have allowed the use of their land and facilities for the benefit of training Owner's dog.

Owner agrees to pay any and all legal fees incurred by Owner, Owner's heirs, their assigns and Ronnie Smith Kennels, its owner(s), officers, employees, agents or assigns resulting from any attempt to circumvent the term of this Liability Waiver to the detriment of Ronnie Smith Kennels, its owner(s), officers, employees, agents or assigns.

- Be certain to bring appropriate field clothes and shoes at drop off as we will likely be in the field for a little while.
